(UPI) The world's newest heart transplant patient, South African dentist Philip Blaiberg was reported "f u 1 1 y conscious and in good condition," following his five-hour surgery Tuesday in Cape Town.

Blaiberg spoke his first words Wednesday Wednesday morning after b e i n g kept under sedition all night. He said: "I am

thirsty."

fllaiberg received the strong heart of a young colored man who d i c d earlier of a stroke.

Doctors said t h e y will take extra precautions with Blaiberg because Louis Washkansky may not have received e nough rest after his historic surgery.

(AP) Cambodia's Chief of state, Prince Sihanou. has lambasted some un-named French advisers to his Cabinet. Sibanouk said the advisers were either "Red or Pink" and were not happy because Communist China was unhappy.

The advisers apparently demanded Cambodia fight back if the U.S. troops entered their country in

pursuit of Communist forces.

### CONGRESS PUTS RESTRICTION IN NEW SOC. SECURITY BILL

(UPI) President Johnson gave the go-ahead for an elite commission to propose a revolutionary overhaul of the Nation's welfare system.

Jennson created the special commission Tuesday night when he signed a 13 percent social 80curity benefit increase.

As he signed the measure, he noted restric-tions Congress inserted in the bill, freezing the quota of mothers and freezing chileren en welfare rolls.

The President instructed the Commission to examine every plan which may premise a constructive advance in the welfare system.

Heading the Commissi-on will be Ben Heinman, beart chairman of the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad.

### NEW ADVISER TO LEJ

(AP) President Johnson's choice f o r the Chai man of the Council of Economic Advisers --

reaffirmed Sihanouk his policy of permitting the U.S. to pursue North Vietnamese with Cambodia as a sanctuary.

Sihanouk stated his position emphatically in a speech breadcast Jan 1 in Cambodia and monitored in Washington.

He said the French advisers contended that if Americans infiltrate they can install ther selves on Cambodian ter Sihanouk said ritory. he disagreed.

He repeated his offer to receive an ambassador sent by President Johnsen. He also said, i t would be possible to negotiate "so that the two countries do not become enemies."

The State Department in Washington said any announcement of the sending of a U.S. mission to Cambodia would come from the two countri concerned.

This was taken to mean a simultaneous announcement may be made by Prosident Johnson and Silianouk on the U.S. mission in the near future.
